The program explores why Quebec wild birds have different beaks, feet, and wings depending on their diet and habitat. The goal of our program is to promote an awareness and understanding in the children of the wild birds that surround them and the threats these birds face today. Our enthusiastic biologist uses interactive learning aids such as taxidermy and bird specimens including beaks, feet and wings to engage children in the program.

Optional activity ideas and material will be provided in order to prepare the group in advance of our visit or for follow-up activities.

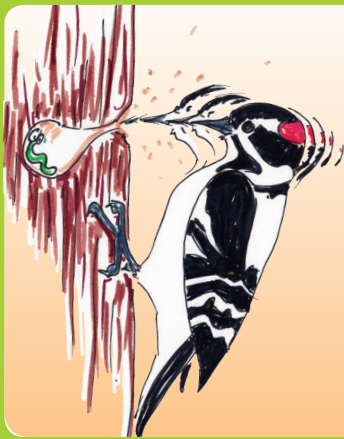
