3

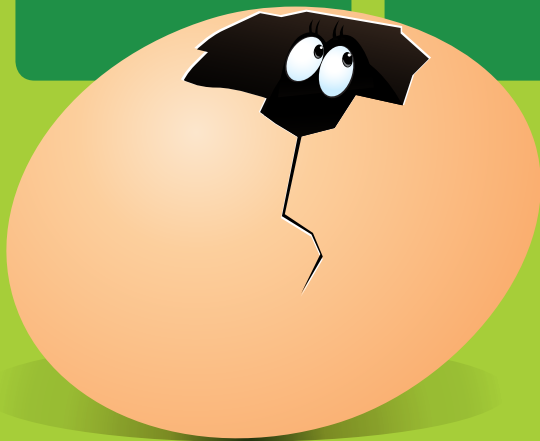
Bird Families
